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Land Acknowledgement

The land on which we gather is the traditional territory of the Erie, Neutral, Huron Wendat, Haudenosaunee and Mississaugas. This land is covered by the Dish With One Spoon Wampum Belt Covenant, which was an agreement between the Haudenosaunee and Anishinaabek to share and care for the resources around the Great Lakes. This land is also covered by the Between the Lakes Purchase, 1792, between the Crown and the Mississaugas of the Credit First Nation. Today, this land is home to many Indigenous people from across Turtle Island. We recognize that we must do more to learn about the rich history of this land so we can better understand our roles as neighbours and caretakers.

The Complete Works of William Shakespeare Abridged is unlike any show I've ever directed. It mixes improvisation and Shakespearean verse with hilarious results. (We hope you agree.)

Given this unusual combination, I began the directing process by providing only a framework for the natural playfulness of the actors using gentle organizational prompts. This allowed them to experiment, laugh, and play. They leaned into this freedom and, as we rehearsed, the structure firmed up around their creativity.

The resulting show that you'll see tonight is truly a collaborative effort filled with moments of inspiration and joy. It's our hope that you have as much fun watching as we had creating. And as the Bard himself would say, "Love all, trust a few, do wrong to none." Enjoy! - Raymond Louter

In her free time, Varana enjoys music, reading, and spending time with friends and family. She's honoured to be part of this incredible team and hopes you enjoy the show!


